#### **FEBRUARY MEETING MINUTES**

The February Cornhusker Model A Meeting was called to order on the 1st by President Gayle Hanshaw at 7:10 p.m. at the Forth Presbyterian Church. There were 28 members in attendance. John Seawell was introduced as he has been a member in the past. Gayle then installed Jeff Meyer as the 2025 Vice-President and Richard Waechter as a board member. The secretary's report was filed as printed.

Linda Buckley gave the treasurer's report. The beginning checking account balance: \$5,494.01 and the ending is \$6,830.20. These were the year end totals. The beginning savings account balance: \$3,712.52 and the ending balance: \$3,716.09. Bills were presented as follows: \$13.87 for stamps for ads by Bill Buckley; \$40 for swap meet by Richard Waechter; \$31.58 for newsletter by Margaret Mays and \$153.10 for Hygiene kits by Nancy Allder. Barb Smith moved the financial report to be accepted as presented and that the submitted bills be paid. Debbie Thomas seconded, and the motion carried.

A separate account was set up in the amount of \$1,500.00 for the 65 in 25 Celebration. The shirts were paid for out of this account and receipts were received. The current balance is \$1,452.31. After discussion it was decided this account will be merged into our regular bank account and this account will be closed.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Membership:</u> Deb Thomas reported two new members. Scott and Cindy Callaway and Sherry Winkinhofer. <u>Activities:</u> Shawn Kean said she would continue as chair of this committee. She asked for volunteers for the March meeting and Joan Taylor and Jerry Waechter said they will bring treats.

<u>Car council/swap meet:</u> Dick Waechter said we will have the same jobs at the swap meet as in previous years. Set up will be Saturday morning March  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  at 9:00 am. On Sunday morning at 6:00 am we should have a minimum of six people to take money.

Gayle Hanshaw reported that we are moving forward with 65 in 25 Celebration. It will be on June 28<sup>th</sup> at Speedway. It will be in conjunction with cars and coffee on that morning. Tim Mattews will cordon off an area for us. We will have a trailer there. The museum sales office will be open until 4:00 and we will be able to use their restrooms. Ed and Joan will handle the registration and pre-registration. We have a flyer, and Gayle would like to put it on our website. Jeff Meier is on the food committee. He said we will have a food truck there from noon until 2:00 pm. He said he is looking at Bar-B-Que. Barb Smith said the Pizza Kitchen in Milford does catering and the Bar-B-Que is very good. Andrew Kein said they used them for their wedding and were very happy. The 2025 budget was reviewed by the membership. #### MODEL A REVIVER

There does seem to be a number of members who have Model A's needing various levels of mechanical assistance to become running and drivable again. I am proposing we create a specific group within the Tech Talk Committee that would meet each month after refreshments. It's mission would be to get as many of those Model A's going again as we can.

Members could present problems and/or questions and seek answers and/or help getting their problems fixed. This would be a general Question and Answer session.

### **Tech Tip**

If your Model A carburetor is warped, try this. Remove gaskets. Apply two adjustable hose clamps and the carburetor bolt and carefully bring the two halves together. Put the carburetor in the oven and turn the heat onto 350-400 degrees. Heat for three hours. Remove the carburetor (it's hot) and let it cool. This may save you from having to have it resurfaced.






